








KING GEORGE V **DATED DIE SERIES** 1935







Beginning with this issue many of Canada's stamps have a 'secret date' hidden within the design. On the low values of this set it is in the portrait oval just to the right of the left hand maple leaf. It appears in various locations on the higher values.

KING GEORGE VI SERIES 1937



The Prince of Wales ascended the throne upon the death of King George V in January, 1936 and became King Edward VII. Stamps were being prepared, but had not been issued when he abdicated in December, giving the throne to his brother, the Duke of York, who became King George VI. The design planned for King Edward was used for the new king. This issue was the first Canadian series to depict the king in civilian attire.



KING GEORGE VI WAR EFFORT SERIES 1942-1943

Canada committed itself to the Allied cause on the outbreak of World War II and declared war on Germany on September 10, 1939, just one week after Great Britain. A war-time definitive replaced the then current issue.





CANADIAN CITIZENSHIP

Passage of the Citizenship Act gave Canadian citizenship to those residents who qualified on July 1, 1947. Prior to that date all Canadians were British subjects. The design is a symbolical Canadian greeting the new day.





ALEXANDER GRAHAM BELL

Issued to commemorate the centenary of the birth of Alexander Graham Bell. Dr. Bell worked out his theory and gave his first successful demonstration of the telephone while living in Brantford, Ontario. He died in 1922 at his summer home in Nova Scotia.

PRINCESS ELIZABETH

Issued to commemorate the November 29, 1947 marriage of H.R.H. Princess Elizabeth to Lieutenant Philip Mountbatten of the Royal Navy.

Celebrating 100 years of Canadian Responsible Government with freedom from control by the Home Office at London.

Halifax, capital of Nova Scotia, founded in 1749, is the leading commercial and cultural city of the Province and a major Canadian port. Stamp depicts the original settlement.





1951 CENTENARY OF THE FIRST CANADIAN POSTAGE STAMP

An International Philatelic Exhibition, "CAPEX," was held in Toronto September 21 to 26, 1951 to celebrate the 100th Annversary of the British North American Postal Administration. Four stamps were released on September 24th, Canada Day, showing old and new methods of transportation and a replica of the 1851 three penny beaver.



Right Honourable Sir Robert Laird Borden. Prime Minister from 1911 to 1920. Directed the mobilization of resources in the war effort. One of the architects of dominion autonomy.

The Right Honourable William Lyon Mackenzie King, Prime Minister 1921-1926 and 1935-1938. Great war-time premier. His guiding principles were national unity and respect for French-Canadian identity.

Sc 350

The Right Honourable Sir John Sparrow David Thompson, Prime Minister from 1892 to 1894. One of the arbitrators in the Bering Sea seal fishery dispute. Died suddenly in 1894 at Windsor Castle.

The Right Honourable Sir Mackenzie Bowell, Prime Minister from 1894 to 1896. Saw vigorous expansion of the Canadian West leading to peaceful conquest of the great new country.

PRIME MINISTERS

Issued to commemorate Prime Ministers who had not been honoured on previous postal issues.

The Honourable Sir John Joseph Caldwell Abbott, Prime Minister from 1891 to 1892.

The Honourable Alexander Mackenzie, Prime Minister from 1873 to 1878. The Supreme Court of Canada was established during his administration.

1955





The Right Honourable Richard Bedford Bennett, Prime Minister from 1930 to 1935. Largely responsible for the 1932 Ottawa Economic Conference.

The Honourable Sir Charles Tupper, Prime Minister from May 1 to July 8, 1896. Held high offices in Canada for over forty years. Last survivor of the "Fathers of the Confederation."



ROYAL VISIT



The first royal visit to Canada by Princess Elizabeth and the Duke of Edinburgh was celebrated by a stamp bearing their portraits.

1952 **RED CROSS**



Issued to publicize the 18th International Red Cross Conference held July 26, 1952 in Toronto. The first modern Canadian stamp to use a combination of lithography and engraving.

1953 CORONATION QUEEN ELIZABETH II



Medallion Sculpture of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. Designed for the Coronation Issue by Emanuel Hahn, R.C.A., SSC, Toronto.

WILDLIFE SERIES 1953-1957

The Canadian Wildlife Service tries to conserve one of Canada's most valuable resources. This series was issued to enlighten the public of the need for preserving endangered species.







QUEEN ELIZABETH II REGULAR SERIES

1953

With the death of King George VI in 1952, his eldest daughter came to the throne as Queen Elizabeth II. The first Elizabethan definitive series was released in May, 1953.

QUEEN ELIZABETH II SECOND REGULAR SERIES 1954-1956













The portrait of Queen Elizabeth II was replaced a year later with one of Her Majesty by Dorothy Wilding. Higher denominations in pictorial designs were released between 1954-1956, continuing the policy of showing Canada's resources and industries.

INTERNATIONAL CIVIL AVIATION

PIONEER SETTLERS



In 1905 two new provinces, Alberta and Saskatchewan, were carved out of the Northwest Territories. Regina, which had been the headquarters for the administration of the Territories, became the capital of Saskatchewan. Edmonton, a trade and transportation centre, became the capital of Alberta.

The I.C.A.O. came into being on April 4, 1947 with permanent headquarters at Montreal. This United Nations organization is charged with coordinating and administering all aspects of international civil aviation including floating sea stations and weather-reporting services.

The Boy Scout Emblem between two hemispheres commemorates the 8th Boy Scout World Jamboree, Niagara-on-the-Lake, Ontario.

DAVID THOMPSON

English-born (1770-1857) explorer, geographer, and surveyor. He mapped over 11/2 million square miles of Canada's wilderness.














Issued to publicize Canada's outdoor recreation facilities. The first se-tenant stamps ever issued by Canada were printed in sheets of 200 and issued in 5 x 10 panes of 50. There are fourteen different block combinations that can be made.



QUEBEC 350TH ANNIVERSARY



In June, 1608 Samuel de Champlain with a band of 28 men cut a clearing on the site of what is now the Lower Town of Quebec. The English seized the settlement in 1629, but in 1633 Champlain once again took possession in the name of the King of France and built a new and larger 'Habitation.'


Emphasizes the importance of health to the individual and to the nation.

FIRST ELECTED ASSEMBLY



The speaker's chair and mace, representing the first Assembly of the Province of Nova Scotia met October 2, 1758 in the Court House at Halifax. This was Canada's first elected Assembly, the first step towards today's self-government.

Issued to honour Canadian oil industry development and the 1958 Montreal World Power Conference.

FIRST AIRPLANE FLIGHT



'Jack' McCurdy's bi-plane 'Silver Dart', with a 50 horse power engine and a wing spread of 40 feet, made a half mile powered flight near Baddeck, N.S. on June 23, 1909. The next day he took it up again and flew eight miles in eleven minutes, eight seconds.

ST. LAWRENCE SEAWAY



1959-1961

A joint undertaking of the governments of Canada and the United States made the interior sections of North America accessible to deep draft ocean-going vessels. On Dedication Day, June 26, 1959, both countries issued stamps with a common design.

It is estimated that about four hundred St. Lawrence Seaway stamps were printed with the blue central portion inverted. Of the three hundred sold to the public, about 150 have been found or are known to have been destroyed. This is the only such error to have occurred in Canada except for a single example on a revenue stamp issue.

GIRL GUIDES



A non-political, non-sectarian organization for young girls. Formed in 1910 by Sir Robert Baden-Powell and his sister Agnes.

Commemorating the visit of Queen Elizabeth and Prince Philip to Canada, June 18 to Aug. 1.

EMILY PAULINE JOHNSON




To honour the 100th Anniversary of the noted Mohawk poetess' birth and the contributions of all Canadian Indians.

BATTLE OF THE PLAINS OF ABRAHAM



Generals Montcalm and Wolfe, both fatally wounded in the battle for Quebec in 1759, are honoured by a common monument outside the walls of Quebec.







ARTHUR MEIGHEN



Prime Minister from 1920-21 and again in 1926. Chief proponent of nationalising all major railroads except the Canadian Pacific.

JEAN TALON



Administrator of New France from 1665-1668. Encouraged industry and farming and brought in young French ladies to become wives of bachelor settlers.

EDUCATION



'Strength through Education' symbolised by illustrations of more than 30 facets of education.

NATURAL RESOURCES VICTORIA CENTENARY



Resources for Tomorrow. Issued to publicize the close link between industry and the country's renewable natural resources.



Victoria, one of the oldest and second largest city of British Columbia, was founded as a fur trading headquarters.

RED RIVER SETTLEMENT TRANS-CANADA HIGHWAY



In spite of fur traders' attempts to keep them out, Thomas Douglas, Earl of Selkirk, and a small band of Scottish Highlanders established a colony on the Red River.



Commemorating the official opening of the world's longest highway.

COLOMBO PLAN



Tenth anniversary of Plan under which the Commonwealth countries extended technical and financial aid to Asian countries.









CENTENARY OF CONFERENCES

CHARLOTTETOWN



QUEBEC



Leaders of the Maritime Provinces and Upper and Lower Canada met September 1-9 at Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island to discuss the advantages to be gained from confederation.

In October the delegates, joined by two representatives from Newfoundland met again in Quebec. Plans drawn in Quebec were the basis of the 1867 British North America Act which established the Dominion of Canada.

Queen Elizabeth II visited both Conference sites during her 1964 visit to Canada.




Britain's noted statesman, author, World War II leader, honoured by a Canadian stamp in the year of his death.
