

Originally called 'baggataway,' now officially adopted as the national game of Canada.



CENTENARY ROYAL CANADIAN MOUNTED POLICE




Commissioner G. A. French and Map of 1874 Trek.

The Royal Canadian Mounted Police, under the authority of Commissioner G. A. French, was Canada's task force that supervised 300,000 square miles of wilderness and laid the foundation for the growth of the Northwest Territories. Their commitment included the establishment and maintenance of law and order, the vigilant protection of the native Indians, and the supportive assistance to incoming settlers, many of whom were without experience in wilderness survival.
