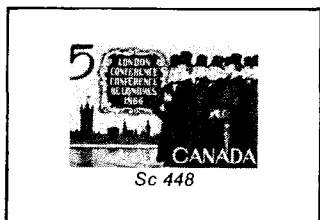
Research satellite developed by Canadian scientists and launched on November 28, 1965.

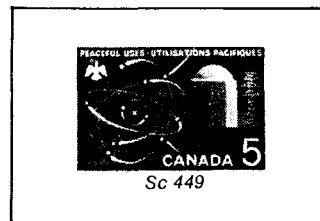

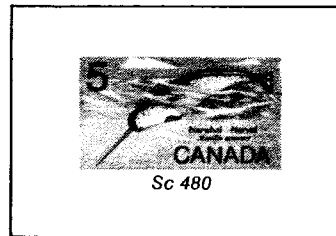
Found in British Columbia and the Yukon, this bird is affectionately called 'Camp Robber.'

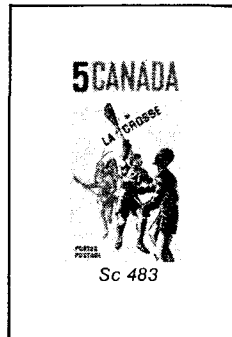

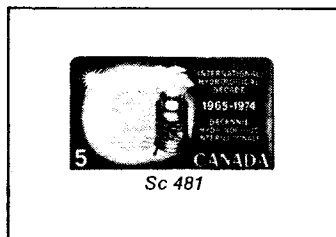
A small whale, about sixteen feet in length, found only in the Arctic seas.

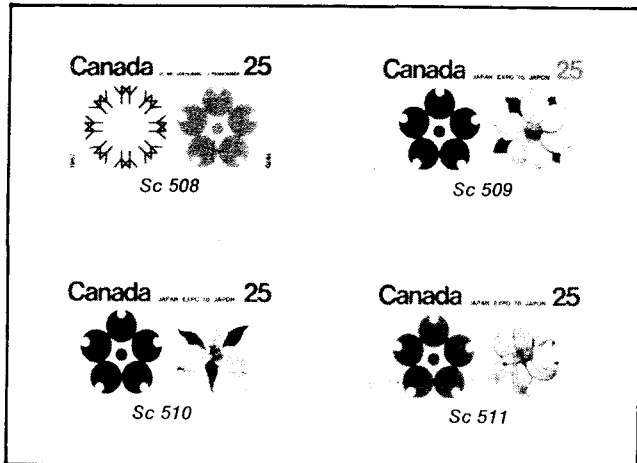
The first white man to see the great herds of buffalo on the northern plains, he journeyed across parts of Manitoba and Saskatchewan in 1690-92.

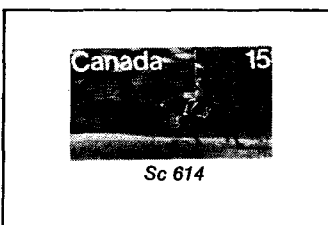


Commissioner G. A. French

The Royal Canadian Mounted Police, under the authority of Commissioner G. A. French, was Canada's task force that supervised 300,000 square miles of wilderness and laid the foundation for the growth of the Northwest Territories. Their commitment included the establishment and maintenance of law and order, the vigilant protection of the native Indians, and the supportive assistance to incoming settlers, many of whom were without experience in wilderness survival.

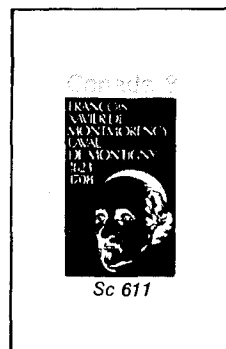
