





The Salvation Army helped attract approximately 250,000 immigrants to Canada around the turn of the century.


REGINA

The federal government chose a place called Pile o'Bones as the capital for the Northwest Territories in 1882 because it was centrally located on the Canadian Pacific Railroad main line. It was renamed Regina and in 1905 became the capital of the new province of Saskatchewan.




Reminiscent of the 1891 Imperial Penny Postage issue, this stamp shows that the sun never sets on the Commonwealth

Edmonton played host to the 1983 World University Games, July 1-11. The games began in Paris in 1923 and are second only to the Olympics $\,$ in scope and size.









The 15th World Scout Jamboree took place July 4-14 in Kananaskis Country, Alta., 80 kilometers west of Calgary.


CURE ANTOINE LABELLE

JOSIAH HENSON

Henson, an ordained minister, founded a settlement and school for blacks near Dresden, Ont. after escaping from slavery in 1830 via the Underground Railroad. He was reputedly the model for Uncle Tom is Uncle Tom's Cabin.











1988 CALGARY WINTER OLYMPICS




