A diplomat, statesman and man of letters, Gov. Gen. Jules Leger saw Canada as a land of toleration and diversity.

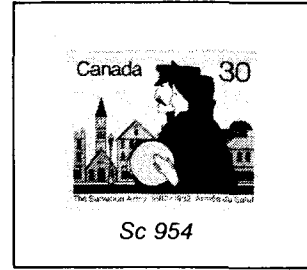
TERRY FOX MARATHON OF HOPE

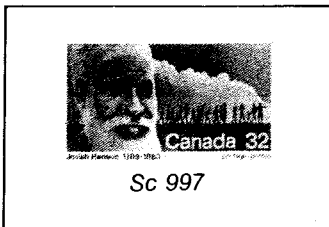
Curé Labelle established parishes in logging districts near Montreal, promoted growth of the railroads and recruited settlers in Europe.

SUDBURY NICKEL DISCOVERY



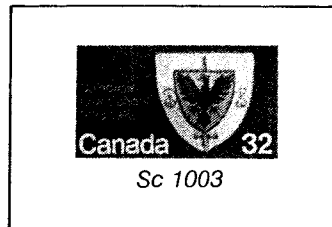

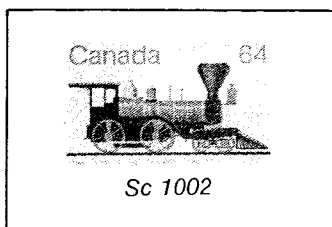
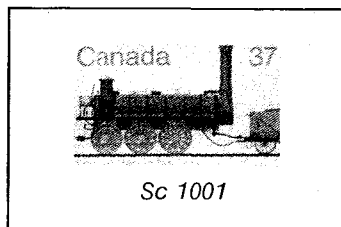
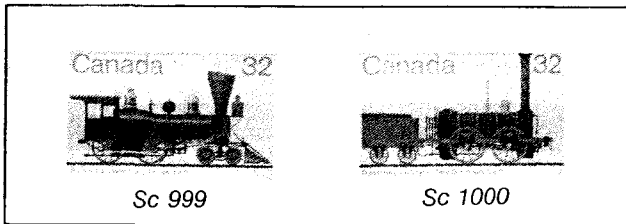
Henson, an ordained minister, founded a settlement and school for blacks near Dresden, Ont. after escaping from slavery in 1830 via the Underground Railroad. He was reputedly the model for Uncle Tom in *Uncle Tom's Cabin*.

DALHOUSIE LAW SCHOOL



Legal training in an academic atmosphere was introduced in 1883 by Dr. Richard C. Weldon, first dean of Dalhousie Law School, Halifax. Graduates include many prime ministers, provincial premiers and Supreme Court judges.

Four from the "iron horse" era. The *Dorchester* was used on the first trip by Canada's first railroad, the Champlain and St. Lawrence (1836), and the *Samson* was the first locomotive in the Maritimes (1838).

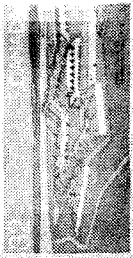
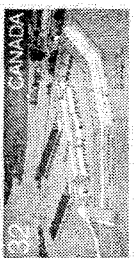
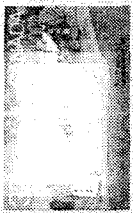
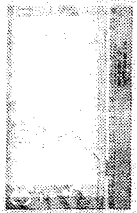

A 1934 gold rush started the mining town of Yellowknife, named for Indians who used copper-bladed knives. It became Northwest Territories' capital in 1967.

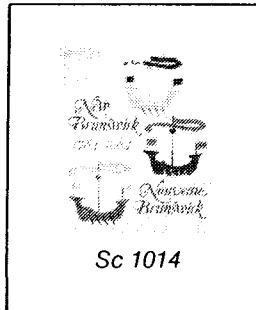

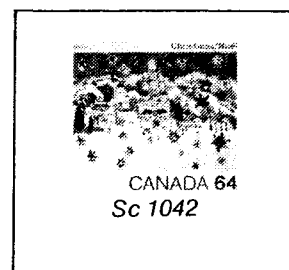
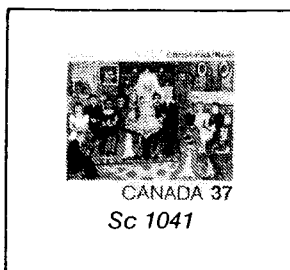
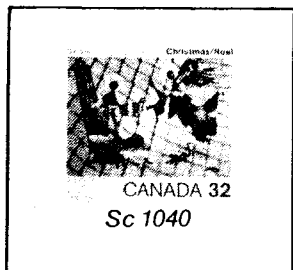
Berthiaume rescued Montreal's floundering five-year-old daily, "La Presse," in 1889 and transformed it into one of Canada's most influential newspapers.

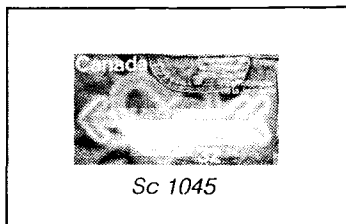

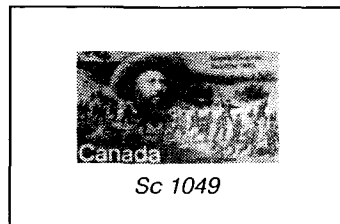

The United Nations proclaimed 1985 as International Youth Year to encourage awareness of and promote solutions to problems faced by young people worldwide.

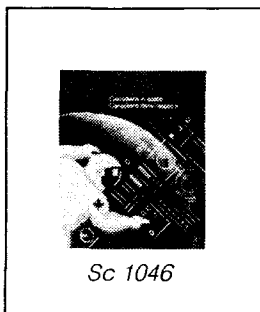
NORTHWEST REBELLION CENTENARY

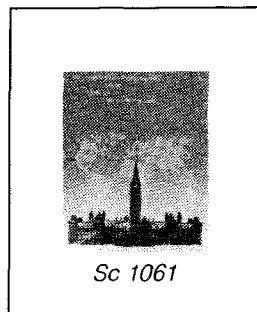


Marc Garneau became the first Canadian in space in October 1984, participating in America's Space Shuttle program.

GIRL GUIDES

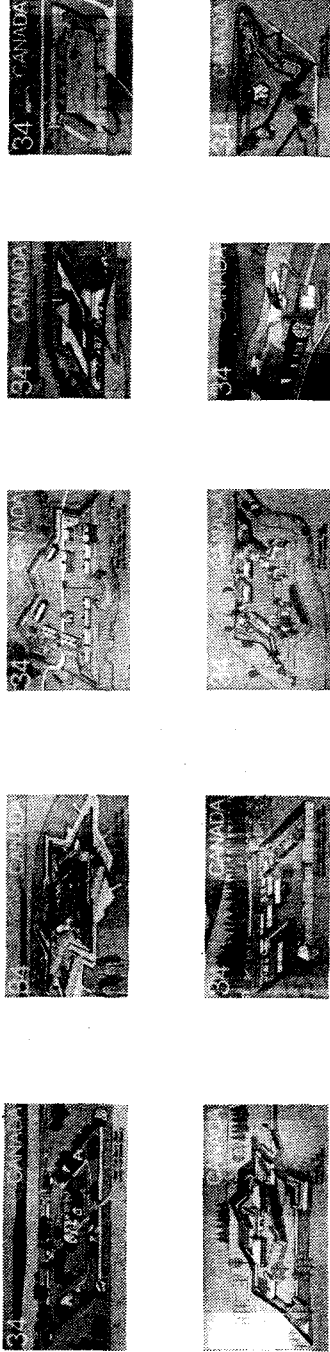
