

Lachine, Quebec, painter Frances Ann Hopkins often got her inspirations when with her husband on business trips to the western wilderness.


### ANGUS WALTERS





#### SMALL CRAFT




Four small crafts native to Canada are depicted on this block of four. The Chipewyan canoe is built narrow and flat-bottomed with birch and spruce for sheathing. The Haida Dugout is made from giant Pacific coast cedars. The Inuit Kayak has been known to be in use for thousands of years. The birch-bark Micmac was used for migration in spring from woods to shore.

#### **EXPLORERS**



Honored are four explorers of the North who traversed lands and water where no one dared to venture. The Chipewyan Indian leader Matonabbe was a guide for the Hearne expedition. Sir John Franklin set sail in search of the famed Northwest Passage. Joseph Burr Tyrrell discovered the fossil beds of Alberta, and entered the barren lands. Vilhjalmur Stefansson studied native peoples and discovered the islands in the Arctic Archipelago.

#### CANADA DAY



Canadian photography is commemorated featuring four early contributors to the field: William Notman (1826-1891), W. Hanson Boorne (1859-1945), Alexander Henderson (1831-1913), and Jules-Ernest Livernois (1851-1933).




Louis-Honore Frechette and Archibald Lampman were two poets with distinctive styles. Frechette is known for his patriotic verse and Lampman for his nature poetry.







#### MULTICULTURAL HERITAGE




Canada's multi-culturalism differs from the "melting pot" of the United States as ethnics are encouraged to preserve their culture in Canadian society.

#### INTERNATIONAL TRADE




Canadian products find their way to international destinations and Canada's government promotes the reduction of world trade barriers.











The West Wind, an oil painting by Tom Thomson, is considered to be "the spirit of Canada manifest in a picture."

Each day, Canada Post moves 35 million pieces of mail and serves over 10 million Canadian addresses.




This stamp celebrates 150 years of systematic and continuous weather observations in Canada.

This stylized drawing of a bird in flight symbolizes the freedom which comes from learning and marks International Literacy Year.






Forest, British Columbia, an oil painting by Emily Carr, is from her nature period and reflects the forest's "solemn splendor and towering strength."

The cedar strip canoe offers a smooth ride for avid canoeists.








## WORLD WAR II, 50TH ANNIVERSARY





#### **WILDERNESS RIVERS**



Rivers shown in this booklet include the South Nahanni River which flows out of the Yukon and contains the scenic Virginia Falls, the Athabasca River, the longest river in Alberta, the Boundary Waters - Voyageur Waterway which flows between Canada and the U.S., the Jacques-Cartier River in Quebec, known for its beauty and historic value as an early travel and trade route, and the Main River, on the Great Northern Peninsula, one of the last remaining near-wilderness areas of Newfoundland and Labrador.

#### **PUBLIC GARDENS**



Featured in this booklet are: the Butchart Gardens, near Victoria, B.C., known for its sunken garden, the International Peace Garden, near Boissevain, on the Manitoba-North Dakota border, which symbolizes the peaceful relations between Canada and the U.S., the Royal Botanical Garden, Hamilton, Ont., known for the largest collection of lilacs in the world, the Montreal Botanical Garden, a highly respected horticultural centre and Canada's oldest surviving public garden, Halifax Gardens.







#### ARRIVAL OF THE UKRAINIANS



The Ukrainian Pioneer, a painting by William Kurelek, is featured on this block of four depicting the many hardships faced by these immigrants.

### DANGEROUS PUBLIC SERVICE OCCUPATIONS



Those in dangerous public service occupations are saluted with this block of four. Search and rescue operations respond to about 9,000 incidents per year. Municipal police forces, which first appeared in Canada in the 1830's were patterned after the London Metropolitan Police. Firefighting is physically demanding and stressful. The Canadian Ski Patrol System began in 1940 and came to the aid of 15,000 skiers in one two-year period.




